Admirals Meeting

His first such topic was the admonition that swimming out into a body of water to retrieve a stalled or dead-in-the-water boat is dangerous and will not be done at Admirals' events. Fact: more boat and ship modelers die at afloat modeling events by drowning than any other cause. Virtually all drowned while attempting to recover an adrift or sunk model.

Mike also wants each meeting to have a theme or focus for that meeting.

Dave McCreary reported on a healthy club bank account and that 23 members had already renewed their Admirals membership by the beginning of the meeting.

It was decided after a brief discussion that the success of the Admirals Holiday Dinner and Party suggests that we hold the 2013 event at the same placethe Castleton Farms Clubhouse on December 12, 2013. Dave McCreary will attempt to make our reservations for that night so we may secure it for our use. December 12 is the normal Admirals meeting night (2nd Thursday of the month).

Again after discussion it was decided that the Admirals would like to again co-host the 2013 edition of **SubRegatta** the first weekend in August this year.

Dave Hampton announced his intentions to set up straight-running courses for competition practice at our monthly scale/Minimono events. Easy to set up and score, our members would gain experience in running their boats in this type event and would have the opportunity to make numerous runs in an event that uses luck as much as skill in accomplishing good results for the competitors. Such competitions could become an integral part of every monthly scale event.

Our traditional summer picnic will likely be conducted June 23rd at the Castleton Farms site if Dave McCreary can obtain that date for us. All agree that Castleton Farms is a great venue and the residents are eager to watch, too.

We welcomed back to the Admirals **Tom Busick** at the meeting. Tom is famous within the mix of club oldtimers as the builder/operator of his "weedwhacker" dreadnought. Just wait....you'll see it this summer, I'd bet.

We also took the time to again thank **Gene Wisner** for his five years' leadership of the club with a certificate personally created by **Mike Yount** (right)







Indoor Fun Float at Carmel HS


These kids (right) are intense controlling the club's Midwest Liberty Tugs. That's what we're about, too. Recruiting.


